**Annual General Meeting

This year’s Eastern Ontario Pleasure Driving Society’s AGM was one that will not be forgotten anytime soon! Close to 50 members and guests enjoyed an evening filled with plenty of conversation, scrumptious food and an outstanding presentation by **Sergeant-Major Bill Stewart, Riding Master for the RCMP**, who spoke about the Force’s driving component.

At the beginning of the meeting, directors reviewed events in 2009 by giving brief reports on their respective areas of responsibilities – finance, education, clinics, communications, history, young drivers, grants and social drives. **Ian Mulligan** is stepping down as a director this year and is being replaced by **Phyllis Begg**. A motion passed to increase the EOPDS membership fee by \$5 beginning in 2011 for both individual and family memberships.

As well, events planned for the upcoming season were discussed, including the junior program.

Members were reminded of two clinics EOPDS is hosting this year – the spring clinic in May with **Jeffrey Kohler** at Sunset Farm and the second with Morris Kerr at Mian Farm in June. Both will be very educational for members of all levels.

With this, the meeting was finished and the winners of the raffle draws were announced. **Sue Vaillancourt** and **Randy Olmstead** won lead ropes, while **Walter Hambleton** won a fleece throw with the EOPDS logo on it.

Mary Mulligan also announced that the club will hold a fundraising raffle this year. See her President's Message on page 1 for more details.

The dinner received rave reviews and the pies were once again a big hit. EOPDS is particularly appreciative to the ladies from Carsonby United Church for providing us with yet another unforgettable dinner.

Guest Speaker

After dinner, members settled back to listen to a fantastic speech by Sergeant-Major Bill Stewart. Everyone knows about the Musical Ride, but the RCMP also has an outstanding collection of carriages that are used at state occasions and for other ceremonial events.

Sergeant-Major Stewart's speech was delivered in tandem with an accompanying Power Point presentation, containing phenomenal photos of the RCMP carriages, harness, horses, drivers and escorts at different ceremonies over the years – occasions like the opening of Parliament, and visits by royalty, heads of state and various dignitaries. Other pictorial events included driving ambassadors new to Canada by carriage to Government House to present their papers to the Governor General, and appearances at Woodbine for the running of the Queen's Plate.

While many of the photos were of bygone eras with, for example, King George VI and Queen Elizabeth in 1939 and Governor General and Madame Vanier in the 1950s, other pictures

gave a sampling of the dignitaries the RCMP has escorted more recently – Governors General Adrienne Clarkson and Michaëlle Jean, the Queen, the late Queen Mother, Nelson Mandela and Mexico's President Fox, just to name a few.

Members had the chance to learn about the different carriages and sleighs that the RCMP owns, the history on each one, as well as the reasons behind postillion turnouts, a must with several of their carriages.

Sergeant-Major Stewart also discussed his time spent honing his driving skills with the coachmen who work for the Queen – tops in the world for ceremonial equipages – and touched on preparing James and George, the two horses the RCMP recently presented to the Queen, for their new roles in Her Majesty's stables.

The audience thoroughly enjoyed his many stories (often humorous) about his various driving-related experiences, and he answered questions following his speech.

EOPDS extends a special thanks to Junior Driver **Savy Mykytyn** for providing the punch during the reception at the beginning of the AGM, and to **Rob Rennie** for getting the Live Oak DVD up and running and for assisting with the RCMP Power Point.

Overall, the evening was most informative and all are looking towards an eventful summer!

Morris Kerr Clinic **By Mary Mulligan**

EOPDS members have benefited in the past from excellent instruction from Francois Bergeron, **Kirsten Brunner**, Gerry McCallum and **Jeff Kohler** at our clinics. We are, therefore, familiar with them. This year, in an effort to provide different approaches and ideas, we have asked a new person to lend us his expertise.

I thought you would appreciate an introduction to Morris Kerr so that you could decide if you'd like to take a lesson or two from him.

Morris is a native of Ormstown Quebec. He has more than 50 years of experience with both riding and driving horses. He started his career working for Fraser Hurdman and Frank Ryan in Ottawa. He then moved to Montreal where he worked for H.J. O'Connell. He was a steeplechase rider and rode hunters and jumpers as well. Then, in London, Ontario, he was whipper-in for the London Hunt.

He then became the coachman for **Jack Pemberton** – a position he held for 13 years. For the next six years, Morris ran his own training business at Whiffletree Stables in Fergus, Ontario, where he trained horses and ponies for both pleasure and combined driving as well as breaking horses to ride.

His next move was to the States where he became the coachman and trainer for Steve and Marilyn McFarlane in Shelbyville, Kentucky. For five years, he showed horses in coaching, tandem, pairs and four-in-hand divisions.

He has worked for Sascha Rockerfeller in Sleepy Hollow, New York, for the past five years.

In 1993, Morris was invited by the Australian Driving Society to give clinics throughout Australia. He competed in Australia's first international combined driving event in 1997 driving a four-in-hand of borrowed ponies.

Morris was a pleasure driving judge recognized by both the American Driving Society and the Canadian Equestrian Federation. He judged the coaching division at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair a few years ago and will be doing so again this year.

Adjectives I would use to describe Morris' teaching style are – soft spoken, kind, encouraging and effective.

Needless to say, Morris has a wealth of experience and expertise to share. Since he is retiring in April and returning to his home farm in Ormstown, we are very fortunate that he has agreed to come to our area and teach us on June 22 and 23.
